Our most essential duty as educators is to protect, nurture, and inspire the curiosity that is inherent in young children.

We do this by encouraging them to make careful observations, to ask thoughtful questions, and to make connections to their world.

Differentiated learning and Responsive Classroom practices are elements of this environment where a child's natural drive to ask more and better questions is refined with the guidance of expert teachers who support and enhance each student's sense of wonder.

Curiosity and the willingness to try, fail, and learn from mistakes is viewed as an essential starting point for learning.





Enrolling in a K-8 school provides wonderful opportunities for students to expand their sense of family and feel connected to a variety of students of different ages, ethnicities, cultures, family structures, and personalities.

We Cultivate an Inquiring Mind



In the Socratic classroom, we begin with the premise that there is always more to learn. Through regular inquiry, our students develop deep understanding and exceptional critical-thinking skills.

The youngest children begin to learn about and practice the tenets of a Socratic classroom by learning how to focus on the speaker and listen with their whole body, to take turns, and to ask one another good questions.

Our relatively small population and our low student-to-teacher ratio allow us to nurture a relationship with each student that keeps them engaged and challenged.

Our program is designed to create a safe space in which students are encouraged to explore, create, and experiment while learning how to communicate and collaborate effectively.

Every day, our teachers weave together arts, academics, and social & emotional learning.

Each of our lower school (K-5) classrooms has a head teacher and a teaching assistant. Lower school students also enjoy the coaching and mentoring of our specialist faculty who teach music, Spanish, art, science, instrumental and vocal music, gardening, and physical education.

Our teachers engage students in powerful, interdisciplinary learning opportunities, requiring students to apply and demonstrate their understanding. We believe teachers, parents, and students should be encouraged to understand the power in emotional and intellectual risk-taking.





For example, first graders take an integrated, hands-on, and fun approach to learning about marine mammals. They study how these animals have adapted to and survive in their environment. In science class, they create layers of blubber and test how long they can immerse their hands in ice-cold water. During writers workshop, they create stories about a chosen marine mammal. Math games, measuring animals with Unifix cubes, shadow puppets, a minilecture from the head of s chool, who is a marine mammal scientist, and a field trip to a local environmental education program are all part of this exciting unit.

What is Socratic Learning?

As students analyze works together—such as books, paintings, songs, historical artifacts, or mathematical formulae—they improve their close reading, critical thinking, and oral communication skills. Because they are in a conversation, they practice civility and listen to diverse points of view. Even the youngest children can engage in a way that acknowledges the richness of questions instead of quickly answering them.

As a facilitator and co-learner, teachers model genuine curiosity, ask clarifying questions, keep the discussion focused on the text, and ensure that all students have the opportunity to participate. A learning environment like this, in which scholarly conversation is central to the culture, nurtures both the intellectual as well as the social and emotional life of the child.

To strengthen their social bonds, our sixth grade class lives in the Marin Headlands for four days in October, combining teambuilding with natural science education in a dramatic setting. The sixth grade English teacher accompanies the class, guiding students to write about their memories of their time at the Headlands as an introduction to their study of memoir.



We Cultivate an Inquiring Mind



Through regular inquiry, our students develop deep understanding and exceptional critical-thinking skills.

Through differentiation, we are able to understand the strengths and challenges of each student, discerning where and how they can grow both academically and emotionally. Through this partnership, students feel safe taking risks and practicing intellectual generosity.

As a "school of thought," one of our guiding principles is teaching students to think deeply about their thinking, and to support all students to do their best possible learning at all times. The capstone experience of the Upper School is the MasterWorks Project, a 40-hour interdisciplinary project undertaken under the supervision of a faculty advisor over many months. Students conceive, research, and develop a project proposal. Past MasterWorks Projects have included novels, musical compositions, photography exhibits, a tunic of chain mail, and hand-sewn couture. Students share their projects with peers and parents at our MasterWorks Project Presentation event.

Tools for Navigating an Evolving Sense of Self

In the Upper School, social and emotional learning is woven into everyday school life, since we know that the most valuable lessons occur both inside and outside of the classroom.

We also schedule an advisory meeting three times per week, where a teacher assumes the role of mentor, advisor, and advocate to small groups of students.

The faculty advisor oversees each child's academic, social, and emotional growth and encourages students to set goals and reflect on their progress.

Every day, our teachers weave together arts, academics, and social & emotional learning.

We are keenly aware of the need to create a student body that is literate and well-versed in the sciences, mathematics, philosophy, technology, world languages, and the arts.

We are a partnership of students, families, and faculty united around our vision of creating a community of passionate, lifelong learners.

We believe that literacy in the arts is not optional but an integral, critical element of our curriculum. Our students are enriched by music instruction, visual arts, and theater arts.


